All the faculties of the college maintain Daily Diary which is mandatory as per Rules of M.P. Higher Education Department. In this Daily Diary he/she has to plan weekly teaching schedule. Both Head of the department and principal keeps supervision on the teaching work of the faculties. The Resource persons are invited for guest lecture on respective subjects. The different areas of syllabus are covered in online video on various topics which are displayed to the students. Apart from this, respective Departments prepare and present their PPTs which are also displayed to the students. Free of cost tutorial and extra classes are conducted for students from different streams, as per directives issued by MP Higher Education Department, Bhopal. As a part of pedagogy, Question Papers of previous years and online videos pertaining to various subject are being made available for the students by the respective Departments and Faculties.

The feedback form incorporates depth of knowledge of the subject, teaching skills of teachers, sincerity, commitment syllabus coverage, and ability to command and control the class, online admission process, availability of books of various subjects, overall development student personality. The information collected through feedback is analyzed by the HODs of various departments. In the analysis the HODs compare the data collected in the current year with those of the previous year. If any deficiency is noticed, it is brought to the notice of Principal. The principal suggests necessary steps for improvement. The Feedback findings are communicated to the respective HODs and faculties for necessary improvement. Faculty members are appraised by the principal in respect of syllabus completion, teaching, library, sports facilities and support towards the betterment of students. Based on feedback form, various stakeholders such as students, alumni and parents are also invited to give their suggestions and further improvements are made as per the Feedback and Suggestions received from various stakeholders.

into an eco-friendly one. • An awareness campaign for the plastic-free campus through signboards and display boards has made the campus overall plastic free. • Since the solar panels were installed, the overall amount of electricity consumed has significantly decreased. • The Colleges consumption of paper has been significantly decreased thanks to the e-academic management system. • Signboards/posters are displayed on the college campus to encourage ideas of plastic-free campuses, noise pollution, and environmental awareness. • LED bulbs are installed in the college buildings and the campus to save electricity. To set an example and inspire all stakeholders to opt for environment friendly alternatives, the College has initiated the following practices: • PLANTATION: The different varieties of plant species are planted at defined intervals in the campus with the help of stakeholders. During last five years, college has planted many medicinal plants. and trees. Present green campus is the outcomes of our sincere efforts. Clean Campus: The green atmosphere in the campus creates a suitable learning environment and also gives lessons regarding how to protect environment and help the human race (Specified in 7.1.5).
